Studying abroad can be such a mind-opening and life-altering experience for students. This past year, the Office of Study Abroad (OSA) sent more Mississippi State students abroad than ever before. Our office is continuing to broaden the horizons of Bulldogs by enthusiastically promoting study abroad opportunities.

Future student travelers can learn more about Mississippi States' study abroad options by participating in our walk-in advising sessions or by attending one of our semester fairs. At walk-in advising every Monday (12-1:30 in McCool 129) and Tuesday (10:30-12 in Old Main 2060) of the Spring 2023 semester, students will speak with an advisor about program options, scholarship opportunities, and any concerns about going abroad. Study abroad fairs feature faculty leaders and provider company representatives who seek to help students step outside their comfort zones and explore new cultures. The spring semester fair will take place on February 8 from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. on the Drill Field.

OSA is continuing to reach pockets of the student population by hosting Gilman Scholarship meetings for Pell Grant recipients and giving presentations in academic classroom settings. Through the spring and summer, we hope to surpass the record-setting numbers of students who partook in study abroad, while continuing to grow Mississippi State as an internationally-minded community.



STUDYING Abroad

Mississippi State offers several different study abroad opportunities that are designed to provide students with an enriching experience to enhance their undergraduate education.

FACULTY-LED PROGRAMS

These courses are designed and led by Mississippi State faculty members where students receive Mississippi State credit. Comprised of mostly Mississippi State students, these courses are taught in groups abroad. Faculty-led program offerings change annually, and updated lists of faculty-led programs are usually released six to eight months prior to each program's start date. These programs are short-term programs over the summer, spring break, and winter term and range in length from one to ten weeks.

EXCHANGE PARTNERS

Mississippi State students enroll directly at the host institution and receive transfer credit at Mississippi State while paying tuition to Mississippi State. Students maintain their student status at Mississippi State during these programs. Some exchange programs are open only to students of a particular major. It is not always required to speak the language of the host country to study abroad at the host institution. Many universities have some or all coursework in English. These programs are long-term programs, either a semester or an academic year. Mississippi State has partner institutions in Japan, Spain, France, and many other popular destinations.

PROVIDER COMPANIES

These programs are organized by an outside company working directly with universities abroad. Mississippi State partners with six different companies to offer a larger selection of programs comprised of students from across the United States. Classes are often taught in English; however, students with sufficient knowledge of a foreign language may choose to take foreign language courses and/or courses instructed in a foreign language. Students maintain their student status at Mississippi State and receive transfer credit at Mississippi State for courses taken abroad. These companies have options for both short (summer) and long-term programs (semester/academic year).



Students who study abroad experience lower unemployment rates and higher academic averages due to the numerous competences gained abroad.

HEALTH & SAFETY

The safety, security, and well-being of study abroad program participants are of the utmost

importance to Mississippi State, the International Institute, and the Office of Study Abroad

All students complete an application, which includes health information and emergency contact information. Students are required to complete an Outbound Orientation, purchase adequate international emergency assistance insurance, and register through the Department of State.

The Office of Study Abroad also emphasizes to students, faculty, and parents that all program participants must take responsibility for their own safety and security just as they would in their home communities.

To ensure added safety and health measures are taken, the Office of Study Abroad closely monitors U.S. State Department (DOS) Travel Advisories and Country Specific Risk Indicators. Regular reviews of reports by the Overseas Security Advisory Council (OSAC), the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO), as well as information provided by trusted security analysis services, local governments and media outlets are also made.

Rest assured; your students will be well-cared for!



SPOTLIGHT ON CONSTRUCTION AND CULTURE ABROAD

Brought to you by the College of Architecture, Art and Design (CAAD), Construction and Culture Abroad is a study abroad program that immerses students in two quintessential European cities: London and Paris. Students will spend two weeks in these cities learning about construction cultures across the centuries. Students will earn three credits in the humanities field and will engage in numerous immersive discussions in the context of hands-on site visits. This is a once-in-a-lifetime chance for students to explore a new lens for their views of the western world.

To learn more about the program, students can meet the faculty leaders at the spring study abroad fair on February 8 from 10 a.m - 2 p.m on the Drill Field. 

1098-T Form

Form 1098-T is an information tax document to aid taxpayers in determining whether they are eligible to claim a tax deduction or one of the education tax credits. **The IRS requires the University to issue Form 1098-T to each student by January 31.** Forms are mailed to the student's address on file. Students may also access this information by visiting the **Office of the Controller and Treasurer**.

Money Matter\$

Past due holds and late fees will be assessed on the October 15th statement. Holds prevent pre-registration for the upcoming semester. Remember, classes fill up fast! In order to be eligible for pre-registration, students must be enrolled in an active payment plan or have a current account balance of zero.

As of October 1, the 2023-24 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available to complete. Students can complete the <u>FAFSA</u> online. The FAFSA will ask for income data from the 2021 tax year. Some federal aid has limited funding. Therefore, to receive maximum consideration for all aid types we encourage your student to complete the FAFSA today.

Scholarships

Do you have a student interested in being considered for scholarship resources for the upcoming academic year? The scholarship applications for the 2023-2024 Academic Year will open on October 1. Current students may apply for competitive, private, and departmental scholarships by completing the General Scholarship Application. The priority date for submitting these applications is March 1, 2023.
