

BULLDOG BUNDLE

Mississippi State University's Bulldog Bundle gives undergraduate students access to all required textbooks, lab manuals, access codes and electronic book versions in a convenient bundle before the first day of class, in most cases, at discounted prices. Through a partnership with Barnes & Noble, Bulldog Bundle allows students to receive required course materials for all classes for a flat fee, regardless of how much each individual textbook/digital access would cost to rent or purchase separately.

Instead of purchasing materials a la carte, the cost is applied to the student's account at the same time tuition is charged. The Mississippi State bookstore provides each student with a convenient package for physical books, and digital materials are automatically populated to students' courses in Canvas.

DINING SERVICES

We provide our campus community with a total of 20 dining locations with options available from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m.! Both dining halls offer a True Balance Station, which addresses all 9 of the 9 most common food allergens with vegan dishes offered at Marketplace at Perry and Fresh Food Company.

All first-year freshmen are automatically enrolled in the Ultimate Meal Plan when they enroll in Housing. This Meal Plan includes Unlimited Block Meals, 10 Guest Meals and \$150 Flex. It is the most convenient Meal Plan for on-campus students, assuring that all of your students' meals are covered. Students enrolled in the Ultimate Meal Plan will recieve a free Ultimate Eco Kit! Students will receive their Ultimate Eco Kit after the first two weeks of the semester and can pick them up in the Dining Office.

PARKING & TRANSIT SERVICES

The Department of Parking & Transit Services is committed to providing safe and reliable parking and transit options to all campus visitors.

PARKING SERVICES

Parking permits will go on sale July 19 (8 a.m.) for Commuter students and July 26 (8 a.m.) for Residential students. Commuter and Maroon Permit zones are available on a first come-first serve basis. Residential permits are guaranteed for the residential zone in which the student is housed.

Permits must be purchased online through your student's myState account.

All permits are digital this year, as your student's license plate will serve as their permit. Residential and Greek permits will be mailed a permit that must be displayed to enter their permitted zone on game days. Students will need to make sure the correct vehicle and license plate is linked on their parking account with their purchased digital permit.

All vehicles on campus must have a digital permit, be registered in a timed/metered area or in ParkMobile. Timed/metered areas are available on Lee Boulevard, at the Roberts Building, Barnes and Noble, Bost Extension, North Garage, or the Old Main Academic Center Parking Garage.

Daily permits are available for visitors, and they are valid in any commuter, staff, or residential area. Daily permits can be purchased at the Roberts Building, Parking and Transit Services Office. Various parking lots are available for use with the ParkMobile app, found in the App Store or Google Play.

TRANSIT SERVICES

Transit Services provide a broad range of transportation services for campus, Starkville, and the Golden Triangle Region. The Starkville-MSU Area Rapid Transit (SMART) system is a free public transit system with daily routes. SMART welcomes all passengers and is committed to providing exceptional service. Our shuttles are equipped with wheelchair lifts and service animals are welcome. Shuttle routes can be tracked in real-time by downloading the TransLoc app.

MONEY MATTERS ACCOUNT SERVICES INFORMATION

- Student accounts will be billed around the 15th of every month and the balance will be due on the 1st of the following month.
- MSU offers payment plans that will allow you to pay tuition, residence halls, meal plans, and other expenses through monthly installments. Learn more on our website at **paymybill.msstate.edu**.
- You must pay the full balance on your student's account (net of aid) or be enrolled in a payment plan by August 1, otherwise, your student's class schedule will be subject to cancellation.
- Don't forget e-Checks are free. If you are using a debit card, avoid the 2.8% convenience fee by choosing the e-Check option. Credit card payments also incur the 2.8% convenience fee.

MSU's **QuikPAY**[®] system allows students to authorize a payer (usually a parent) to access account information and make payments on the student's behalf. To have your student set you up as an authorized payer visit **paymybill.msstate.edu**, click on "Payment" then "Authorized Payer" and have your student follow the instructions. As an authorized payer, you will also receive notification that the *electronic* billing statement is available.

As your student continues their academic career at MSU, it is important to remember student account balances must be paid in full for students to register for a new semester or make changes to an existing class schedule. To avoid unnecessary late fees or registration holds, please be sure your student actively monitors their account and makes timely payments.

COST SAVING TIPS

HOUSING:

Did you know Mississippi State offers multiple housing options? Costs for double occupancy range from **\$2,611 to \$4,294**, potentially saving a student **\$1,683** per semester. A comprehensive list of housing choices and costs are available at **housing.msstate.edu**

DINING:

Freshmen living on-campus are automatically enrolled in the Ultimate Meal Plan. Students can change their plan to either the Gold or Silver plan during the first two weeks, a difference of **\$164** per semester. Check out **msstatedining.com** to explore which meal plan works best for your student. (Utilize your meal plan to the fullest and limit eating out.)

VEHICLES:

Do not bring a car. Parking permits are **\$200** for commuter students and **\$250** for students living on-campus. Parking & Transit Services offers a robust transportation system that is free and accessible, not to mention Mississippi State is a very walkable campus. Carpool home with friends.

TEXTBOOKS:

Do not buy new textbooks. Encourage your student to access Bulldog Bundle or research other options, including used, borrowed, or electronic.

COMPUTERS:

Many majors do not require you to have a personal computer. Visit **its.msstate.edu/services/labs** to learn about our open-access computer labs that is available to all students.

BUDGET:

Create a budget. Do not abuse credit cards. Take advantage of amenities on-campus. Study more, spend less = win, win.
